1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

To receive and consider the annual financial report for the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Director's report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

2. RESOLUTION 1: ADOPTION OF THE REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report contained within the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 31 December 2024.

Note 1: The vote on this resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors of the Company.

A voting prohibition statement applies to this Resolution. Please see below.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR BILL ASHBY

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That Mr Bill Ashby, a Director, retires by rotation in accordance with clause 14.6 of the Company's constitution, ASX Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, and being eligible is re-elected as a Director."

4. RESOLUTION 3 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR CHRIS HODGE

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That Mr Chris Hodge, a Director, having been appointed since the last AGM, retires in accordance with clause 14.5 of the Company's constitution, ASX Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, and being eligible is elected as a Director."

5. RESOLUTION 4 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF OPTIONS – LR 7.1

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.4 and for all other purposes, Shareholders ratify the issue of 4,889,975 Options on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

- a Shareholder who is entitled to cast two (2) or more votes may appoint two (2) proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the member appoints two (2) proxies and the appointment does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes, then in accordance with section 249X(3) of the *Corporations Act 2001*, each proxy may exercise one-half of the votes.

Shareholders and their proxies should be aware that:

- if proxy holders vote, they must cast all directed proxies as directed; and
- any directed proxies which are not voted will automatically default to the Chair, who must vote the proxies as directed.

Voting in person

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions which are the subject of the business of the Meeting.

ASX takes no responsibility for the contents of this notice.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

The business of the Annual General Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 31 December 2024, together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

A copy of the Company's 2024 Annual Report is available on the Company's ASX platform (**ASX: AOK**) and on the website www.australianoilco.com.au. Alternatively, a hard copy will be made available upon request.

The Company's auditor, HLB Mann Judd, will be present at the Annual General Meeting and Shareholders will have the opportunity to ask the auditor questions in relation to the conduct of the audit, the auditor's report, the Company's accounting policies, and the independence of the auditor.

In addition to taking questions at the Meeting, written questions to the Chair about the management of the Company, or to the Company's auditor about:

- (a) the preparation and content of the auditor's report;
- (b) the conduct of the audit;
- (c) accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the Annual Financial Statements; and
- (d) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit,

may be submitted no later than 5 business days before the meeting date to the Company Secretary.

2. RESOLUTION 1: ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's Annual General Meeting, a resolution that the Remuneration Report be adopted must be put to the Shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

The Remuneration Report sets out the Company's remuneration arrangements for the Directors and senior management of the Company. The Remuneration Report is part of the Directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the Company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the Remuneration Report at the Annual General Meeting.

2.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (Spill Resolution) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (Spill Meeting) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the Directors of the Company who were in office when the Directors' report (as included in the Company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the Managing Director of the Company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as Directors of the company is approved will be the Directors of the Company.

2.3 Previous voting results

Greater than 75% of shares were voted in favour of the adoption of the remuneration report at the 2024 AGM.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR BILL ASHBY

3.1 General

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the Director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer.

Clause 14.6 of the Company's Constitution requires that at every Annual General Meeting of the Company one-third of the Directors (rounded down to the nearest whole number) shall retire from office. The Directors to retire are those who have been longest in office since their last election. A Director who retires by rotation under clause 14.6 is eligible for re-election.

The Company currently has 2 Directors (excluding the Managing Director) and accordingly 1 must retire.

Mr Ashby, the Director longest in office since his last election, retires by rotation and seeks re-election as a Director.

3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr Ashby has over 40 years of experience in upstream oil and gas covering the disciplines of geoscience, subsurface engineering, drilling, development, and production.

Over that time, Mr Ashby has spent 16 years within SE Asia, including five years working within the Philippines. He has a track record of finding and developing significant discoveries, most recently in PNG, Caldita/Barossa in Australia, Gulf Coast USA (Eagleford Shale) and Madura Strait Indonesia.

Mr Ashby is focussed on business outcomes that lead to upstream development and production of resources. He has small to mid-cap Australian listed company experience, complemented by major company experience (ConocoPhillips and Mobil) internationally.

3.3 Independence

If re-elected, the Board considers Mr Ashby will be an independent Director by virtue of being a Non-executive Director.

3.4 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 2 is passed, Mr Ashby will be re-elected to the Board as a Non-executive Director.

If Resolution 2 is not passed, Mr Ashby will not be re-elected to the Board as a Non-executive Director and the Board will have the capacity and requirement under its constitution of appointing a Director to ensure it can make up a quorum for meetings of Directors. This Director would then be required under the constitution and the ASX Listing Rules to stand for re-election at the next AGM.

3.5 Board recommendation

The Board unanimously supports the re-election of Mr Ashby.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR CHRIS HODGE

4.1 General

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the Director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer. However, a director appointed to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the board must not hold office (without re-election) past the next annual general meeting of the entity.

Clause 14.5 of the Company's Constitution requires that a Director appointed by the Board will hold office only until the next Annual General Meeting and is then eligible for re-election. Accordingly, Mr Hodge seeks election as a Director.

4.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr Hodge is a highly experience and successful manager of oil and gas E&P companies. A geologist and geophysicist by training, Mr Hodge has acted as both a Non-executive and Managing Director with ASX listed companies – most recently at Adelphi Energy Ltd, ROC Oil Company Ltd and Horizon Oil Ltd. He has also acted as a trusted advisor to both Mitsui & Co Ltd. and Mitsubishi Corporation.

At Adelphi, Mr Hodge as MD guided the company to being a first mover in the Eagleford shale in Texas; at ROC he was a NED of the company which was taken over by Fosun; and at Horizon, Mr Hodge oversaw the transition from a troubled exploration and production company with a PNG focus, to a debt-free dividend paying entity with strong oil production and a bright future.

Mr Hodge has worked extensively overseas (Argentina, USA, Thailand, Indonesia, China and NZ), however he retains a deep working knowledge of the Australia oil and gas producing basins – especially in WA and Queensland. Chris holds a B.Sc (Hons) in Geology from Liverpool University, a M.Sc in Structural Geology from Imperial College and a Graduate Diploma in Applied Finance and Investment from the Securities Institute of Australia.

4.3 Independence

If re-elected, the Board considers Mr Hodge will be an independent Director by virtue of being a Non-executive Director.

4.4 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 3 is passed, Mr Hodge will be re-elected to the Board as a Non-executive Director.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, Mr Hodge will not be re-elected to the Board as a Non-executive Director and the Board will have the capacity and requirement under its constitution of appointing a Director to ensure it can make up a quorum for meetings of Directors. This Director would then be required under the constitution and the ASX Listing Rules to stand for re-election at the next AGM.

4.5 Board recommendation

The Board unanimously supports the re-election of Mr Hodge.

5. RESOLUTION 4 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF OPTIONS – LR 7.1

5.1 General

On 23 October 2024 the Company issued 4,889,975 Options (**Broker Options**) exercisable at \$0.008 each on or before 30 June 2026 as a facilitation fee consideration to Sanlam Private Wealth who acted as lead manager for the Company's share placement announced in June 2024. The terms of the Broker Options are detailed at Appendix 1. The value of the options issued was \$4,734 per Appendix 2.

The issue of Options was made pursuant to the Company's discretionary placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1. Resolution 4 of this Notice seeks Shareholder approval to ratify the issue.

5.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 7.4

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 provides that the Company must not issue or agree to issue, subject to specified exceptions, more equity securities during any 12-month period than an amount which, when aggregated with the number of other securities issued within that 12-month period, represents 15% of the number of ordinary shares on issue at the commencement of that 12-month period, unless the issue falls within one of the nominated exceptions, or the prior approval of members of the Company at a general meeting is obtained.

ASX Listing Rule 7.4 sets out an exception to ASX Listing Rule 7.1. It provides that where a company in a general meeting ratifies the previous issue of securities made pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.1A (and provided that the previous issue did not breach ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.1A) those securities will be deemed to have been made with Shareholder approval for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.1A.

While the Options described in this Resolution 3 have been issued within the 15% limit, the Company seeks Shareholder ratification of the issue of these Options for the purpose of Listing Rule 7.4 so that the Company may retain the flexibility to issue equity securities in the future, up to the 15% annual placement capacity set out in ASX Listing Rule 7.1, without the requirement to obtain prior Shareholder approval, should the need or opportunity arise.

5.3 Technical Information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 4 is passed, the Options issued will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of issue of the Options.

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the Options will be included in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of issue of the Options.

5.4 Technical information required for Resolution 4

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to this Resolution 4:

- a) The total number of Options issued by the Company (on 23 October 2024) was 4,889,975 under Listing Rule 7.1. The Options are exercisable at \$0.008 on or before 30 June 2026;
- b) The Options were issued to Sanlam Private Wealth, who acted as lead manager facilitating the Company's placement announced in June 2024. The Options were issued as a component of Sanlam's fee for acting as lead manager;
- c) A summary of the material terms of the Options are included at Appendix 1; and
- d) The Options were issued for nil cash by way of consideration. The value of the Options is \$4,734 using a Black-Scholes option valuation method as identified in Appendix 2.

6. SPECIAL RESOLUTION 5 – APPROVAL OF LISTING RULE 7.1A MANDATE

6.1 General

ASX Listing Rule 7.1A provides that an Eligible Entity may seek Shareholder approval at its annual general meeting to allow it to issue Equity Securities up to 10% of its issued capital over a period up to 12 months after the annual general meeting (**10% Placement Capacity**).

An Eligible Entity is one that, as at the date of the relevant annual general meeting:

- (a) is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index; and
- (b) has a maximum market capitalisation (excluding restricted securities and securities quoted on a deferred settlement basis) of \$300,000,000.

The Company is an Eligible Entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a current market capitalisation of approximately \$2.0 million.

Any Equity Securities issued must be in the same class as an existing class of quoted Equity Securities. The Company currently has one class of quoted Equity Securities on issue, being the Shares (**ASX Code: AOK**).

If Shareholders approve Resolution 5, the number of Equity Securities the Eligible Entity may issue under the 10% Placement Capacity will be determined in accordance with the formula prescribed in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2, being $(A \times D) - E$, whereby:

A = number of fully paid ordinary (**FPO**) securities on issue at commencement of the relevant period; plus
the number of FPO issued in the relevant period under exceptions in Listing Rule 7.2¹; plus
the number of FPO issued in the relevant period with approval under Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4; plus
the number of partly paid ordinary securities that become FPO in the relevant period; less
the number of FPO cancelled in the relevant period.

D = 10%; and

E = the number of equity securities issued or agreed to be issued under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the relevant period where the issue or agreement has not been subsequently approved by the holders of its ordinary securities under Listing Rule 7.4. The effect of Resolution 5 will be to allow the Company to issue Equity Securities up to 10% of its fully paid ordinary securities on issue under the 10% Placement Capacity during the period up to 12 months after the Meeting, without subsequent Shareholder approval and without using the Company's 15% annual placement capacity granted under Listing Rule 7.1.

Resolution 5 is a Special Resolution. Accordingly, at least 75% of votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote at the Meeting must be in favour of Resolution 5 for it to be passed.

If Resolution 5 is passed, the Company will be able to issue up to 10% of its fully paid ordinary share securities on issue under the 10% placement capacity during the period of up to 12 months after the approval.

If Resolution 5 is not passed, the Company will not be able to issue up to 10% of its fully paid ordinary share securities on issue under the 10% placement capacity during the period of up to 12 months after the approval.

The exact number of Equity Securities that the Company may issue under an approval of Listing Rule 7.1A will be calculated according to the following formula contained within that Listing Rule.

6.2 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.1A

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.3A, the information below is provided in relation to this Resolution 5:

(a) Minimum Price

The minimum price at which the Equity Securities may be issued is 75% of the volume weighted average price of Equity Securities in that class, calculated over the 15 ASX trading days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 ASX trading days of the date above, the date on which the Equity Securities are issued.

¹ Issues under LR 7.2 exception 9 must be a conversion of convertible securities that were issued or agreed to be issued before the commencement of the relevant period, or issued during the relevant period with approval under LR 7.1 or 7.4

Issues under LR 7.2 exception 16 relate to an agreement to issue securities. To comply with LR 7.2 exceptions, the agreement to issue securities must have been entered into either before the entity was listed and the agreement disclosed in its prospectus, PDS or information memorandum, or if the agreement entered into after listing, the agreement have complied with the Listing Rules.

(b) **Approval period**

The Equity Securities may be issued under the 10% Placement Capacity commencing on the date of the Meeting and expiring on the first to occur of the following:

- (i) 12 months after the date of this Meeting;
- (ii) the time and date of the entity's next annual general meeting; and
- (iii) the time and date of approval by Shareholders of any transaction under ASX Listing Rules 11.1.2 (a significant change to the nature or scale of the Company's activities) or 11.2 (disposal of the Company's main undertaking).

(c) **Risk of economic and voting dilution**

Any issue of Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity will dilute the interests of Shareholders who do not receive any Shares under the issue.

If Resolution 5 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues the maximum number of Equity Securities available under the 10% Placement Capacity, the economic and voting dilution of existing Shares would be as shown in the table below.

The table below shows the dilution of existing Shareholders calculated on the basis of the current market price of Shares and the current number of Equity Securities on issue as at the date of this Notice.

The table also shows the voting dilution impact where the number of Shares on issue (variable A in the formula) changes and the economic dilution where there are changes in the issue price of Shares issued under the 10% Placement Capacity.
